The Serve team has designated C.I.S.D. Family Services, most easily recognized by one of its components "Stuff the Bus," as the August Mission of the Month. C.I.S.D. Family Services, directed by Alison Walker, is the umbrella organization for numerous support services for children enrolled in C.I.S.D. and their families.

Of all its programs, "Stuff the Bus" is the most timely. "Having supplies on the first day of school builds a child's confidence and gets the year off to a good start, but they can be expensive," noted Walker. "Having an agency that provides essential items is very helpful."

Family Services also provides laundry and hygiene facilities and supplies to students and their families. If a clean set of clothes is needed, Family Services has them. Ms. Walker can also use her vast network to rally the entire community to aid a family experiencing a devastating emergency like a house fire. When the family needs everything including lodging, food, clothes, and furniture, citizens throughout Commerce step up and donate items.

Let's show C.I.S.D. kids that FUMC cares.




Notes from Pastor Cheryl


