#### **STAR WORDS**



No, not "Star Wars!" Star words! January is the month we are coming off Christmas celebrations, but we still want to remember Epiphany, traditionally the celebration of the magi finding the baby Jesus after following the star. They also brought their gifts. We are also seeking Jesus, trusting God can/does use many signs (or stars) to guide us closer to the Divine presence.

You are invited to take a star from the Gathering Area for the first few weeks of January. On each of the stars is a word. I invite you to trust the word that selects you.

For last year's words belong to last year's language and next year's words await an other voice. (t s eliot)

The most common prayer practice for many people involves speaking to God as opposed to silence or listening to God speak to us. Star words invite a new prayer rhythm of reflection that can be a powerful new way to connect to God. By not looking at or sorting through the words, we practice the spiritual task of receiving. We trust that God is present, and we let go of our desire to control.

So choose a Star Word during the first few weeks of January. I will be anxious to hear how your word fits your situation!

## BEGINING SUNDAY, JANUARY 15 AT 11:15 — 12:15 (AFTER WORSHIP AND GATHERING TIME)

When persons who were baptized as infants or younger children are ready to profess their Christian faith, they participate in a series of lessons in which they learn what it means to be a full member of the church. This process is called Confirmation. These classes will lead up to a Confirmation worship service, possibly on or around Easter (April 9). It is the first public affirmation of the grace of God in baptism and the acknowledgment of that grace by faith.

A small group of confirmands were left hanging by the pandemic now going on three years ago. These classes are for them and any other 5<sup>th</sup> grader (12-13 years old) and up who would like to participate. The students will study and discuss with the pastor and their peers all the elements of the Christian story – creation, sin, and redemption, as well as repentance of sin, the saving grace of God, new life in Christ, and becoming an instrument of God's purpose in the world. On their Confirmation Day in April they will voice the baptismal vows as a witness to faith, "remembering their baptism," and they will profess their personal experience of the Christian faith.

If you are an adult and would like to participate in a Confirmation class to learn more about the Christian faith in general and specifically the Wesleyan Methodist version, let Pastor Cheryl know and it's possible we can offer the class at a different time for adults, and also the classes could combine sometimes for special events and projects.
