MISSION OF THE MONTH-THE RAFFA CLINIC

The Serve tram has selected the Raffa Clinic to be the June Mission of the Month. Raffa, the phonetic spelling of Jehovah Rapha, "Christ the Healer" was begun in 2000 by the Highland Terrace Baptist Church's women's ministry. They wanted to support young pregnant girls by providing diapers and baby clothes, as well as spiritual gifts. Like F.I.S.H., the program blossomed into a multitude of services. Today, the clinic also supplies formula and baby wipes, as well as diapers and baby clothes. Its other services include pregnancy tests, sonogram exams, parenting classes, and one-on-one counseling for women who have had an abortion and regret their decision. Raffa can administer a pill that reverses a drug induced abortion, as well. The clinic also gives young women information about adoption agencies.

Although Hunt County and northeast Texas are the target areas, no one is turned away. According to clinic director Threesa Sadler, 1260 clients received services in 2022. The clinic is located at 2612 Jordan Street in Greenville and can be reached at 903-454-9711.

The following is a true story of Raffa's help directly in our community. Two weeks ago, Kelli Howard was working at the Blessings table when a young couple living at the motel next door walked up with their 8 month old baby. They needed EVERYTHING -- money to pay the motel, food (they were feeding the baby powdered milk), and baby things. The husband had found a job but had not yet started work. The call went out for possible resources. Raffa was mentioned. Pastor Cheryl used her benevolence monies to pay the motel. Food came from our Blessings table. That SAME afternoon, Bill Heitholt's daughter- in-law Debbie, a nurse on staff at Raffa, personally delivered formula, diapers, baby wipes and 4 onesies to the church.

If you want to support Raffa's work, there are several ways you can help.

- 1. Drop dollar bills or a check with Raffa on the memo line, in the collection plate on the Sundays in June. If you give online, you can use the QR code on the bulletin and select Mission of the Month.
- 2. Donate packages of baby wipes. A bin will be in the gathering area for your donations.
- 3. Be on the lookout for the date and time for Raffa's annual fundraiser dinner. (This event is for adults only due to some of the topics discussed.)

As Pastor Cheryl encouraged in her sermon, let us "take the next step" as we strive to be Christ's hands and feet.

Pentecost is both an event in the life of the church and a season that lives out the implications of the event.
