MISSION OF THE MONTH-NORTH TEXAS FOOD BANK

The North Texas Food Bank is the March Mission of the Month. Imagine for a moment you are a parent who relies on the schools to consistently provide their children with breakfast and lunch. Any holiday season, with its own stressors but also a promise of happy times, only produces heightened anxiety for these parents. Though inflation has come down, most food prices have not. It also renders one of the best ways to break the grip of poverty – education – ineffective. Studies show a correlation between food insecurity and success in school. Hungry children are too tired to focus on their class work and have trouble remembering. Make no mistake, CISD has food-insecure students. Former counselor Harriet Williams recalls some students literally licking their plates clean. One third grader being interviewed for a special food program was asked what he liked to eat at dinner. His response? "Oh, we don't have dinner. We just go to bed."

Where can a parent go for assistance? Food stamps? Perhaps. However, with the Covid pandemic officially declared over and new regulations regarding eligibility, some families may no longer have access to this resource. The State of Texas? Highly unlikely. Although we live in a wealthy state, Texas ranks second in the nation in the number of food insecure households, behind Arkansas but ahead of Mississippi, according to the FDA.

The North Texas Food Bank is DEFINITELY a great asset for those who are food-insecure in our community. The NTFB, 8th largest in the U. S., is a major supplier for the Commerce Food Pantry and Bread of Life Church of the Nazarene, both of which continue food distributions throughout the holidays. The NTFB provides much of the staples included in the Thanksgiving and Christmas Hunt County Shares boxes. The NTFB also administers the Food-4-Kids program, which gives eligible kids special backpacks with shelf-stable foods to take home over the weekend. In 2023, the NTFB partnered with 300 schools, serving 1,100 children with 730,000 meals.

To support the NTFB, you can:

- Drop dollar bills or a check with "NTFB" on the memo line in the collection plate during March. If you give online, just click on the appropriate tab. Every \$1.00 donated provides three meals.
- 2. A group of church members, including youth, can volunteer at the Plano location.

Let's heed the admonition in Matthew 25 to be on the right hand of God by feeding the hungry.

Notes From Cheryl



At the first of every year, we as a local church, take stock of our financial situation, income (giving) and expenses for the year. We also count our members, and take stock of who has come and gone. For the year 2023, we had a count of 189 members. The number of members engaged in ministries with the poor went up 21 percent and the number of persons served by our community ministries for outreach, justice, and mercy increased 49 percent

to over 2500 people, largely because of the ministries we provide to the poor and marginalized. We counted at least 20 of these ministries, including the Commerce Food Pantry, Clothe-A-Child, Blessings Table, Bread of Life, Manna Movers, Prayer Shawl, Angel Tree Prison Ministries, and more. That's a number to celebrate. God gives us the vision and provides the means!

Holy Week is coming up the last week of March. We will begin Sunday March 24 with a Palm Sunday Celebration, led by children and youth, with beautiful music by our choir to take us through the events of that week when all our ideas about the Kingdom of God were "up-ended" by the crucifixion, then resurrection of Jesus.



After Palm Sunday worship, we will have a Gathering with coffee and pastries while we watch the children's Easter Egg Hunt. Thursday of Holy Week (Maundy Thursday, March 28) at noon, we will celebrate Holy Communion in the Sanctuary with an opportunity to visit "Stations of the Cross." We hope you will join us for these worship services, plus our Easter Sunday Celebration on March 31.
