# CLOTHE-A-CHILD OCTOBER MISSION OF THE MONTH by Judy Rudoff

The Mission of the Month for October is Clothe-a-Child. Imagine how nice a new jacket or new gloves or a new pair of PJs would be for a child in need. This county-wide organization, partnering with Wal-Mart, provides such items for qualified students. According to Belinda Miller, Commerce coordinator, students are recommended for the program by counselors, teachers and even social service agencies. Once a child's eligibility is verified, every school-aged member of the household also becomes eligible. That might also include the baby of a teenage student.

In 2021, about 185 Wal-Mart gift cards for \$60.00 were distributed to students early on a December morning. Mrs. Miller went on to say that the exact method to distribute funds this year has yet to be determined. She also stated that Wal-Mart has not reported any misuse of the cards.

This program NEVER operates at a deficit. The total amount of donations determines the amount of the gift card for each recipient. Families are not notified of their inclusion until the money is at hand.

# Trustees Report-September 2022

Your Trustees have been actively working on managing our Church properties.

Now that our roof has been replaced and our drainage issues fixed, we will begin work soon on the gathering area, repairing the water damage in the ceiling and replacing the carpet.

We have started trimming our trees to give a better visual reference to our Church and opening up our facade. This is ongoing and plans are to continue trimming and perhaps removing more trees on the north, along with finishing stump grinding. Your input and suggestions are welcomed.

We were able to clean out our container storage that sits in the back of our parking lot. The tables and chairs were donated to area churches and were much appreciated. This has enabled us to move items that have accumulated and freed up space for the growth we have experienced in the Little Ark program. We built shelving and created a storage area for all of their needs. Additionally, we have moved the growing Prayer Shawl ministry into the Dough Rollins classroom. We are also in the process of creating space for our Youth program in one of the classrooms.

We had workday this spring and a team of three mowing throughout the spring and summer to help offset some of the cost to our Church.

It was a pleasure for us to help Pastor Cheryl move into our parsonage and have cleaned and fixed up around the house. There is more to be done. We will soon be replacing some windows, cleaning out the gutters and such.

We plan in the fall to begin clearing the woods behind our Church (on the west) to create a more open area that we will be able to mow and maintain.

There is more to do, and some of our future plans include resurfacing and striping the parking lot on the south, replacing/repairing our sidewalks and adding some signage.

We have a list of suggestions we have received, but lack the resources or person power to pursue. If any member of our Church family would like to help out with or take on any of the projects listed below, that would be wonderful.

- 1. Parking lot garage sale of items around our church that are no longer needed, along with donations.
- 2. Church pews upgrade capital campaign. We have the cost and a plan but need someone to conduct a fund raising campaign.
- 3. Landscaping. We have a few spaces to plant new foliage now that we have removed a few trees.

Lastly, we are but a few but we are mighty, and we are passionate about taking care of our beautiful properties. Any and all help is appreciated. Contact any Board Member with your questions or comments.
