Clothe-a-Child has been designated the October Mission of the Month. Before Covid, eligible families gathered at Wal-Mart at 6 a.m. to buy new clothes. Today, Wal-Mart gift cards are given to families to be used throughout the year as needed. In 2023, there were 251 children who received \$50.00 gift cards according to Commerce coordinator Belinda Miller. This year the Wal-Mart cards for all CISD eligible students may be picked up at Commerce Elementary. Along with the gift cards is a detailed list of eligible items. Those for whom transportation is not readily available, Alison Walker, CISD Family Services coordinator, makes home visits to deliver them.

Students are suggested by teachers, counselors, even parents. Once Mrs. Miller establishes a child's eligibility, ALL school-aged children in the household become part of the program. Two exceptions are special needs students who may receive cards until they are 21 and infants of moms enrolled in CISD. Items for the baby may be purchased with their card. Wal-Mart has reported that there has not been any abuse of the cards. Clothe-a-Child is a pay-as-you-go organization. No family is notified of their acceptance until there are funds to supply the cards.
