
MISSION OF THE MONTH-THE WESLEYAN CAMPUS MINISTRY




- 1. Pray for the director and students as they travel on their faith journey.


place at Christ's table, we accept a way of life that embraces God's definition of love, peace, grace, and joy. Let us celebrate the depth of communion to which we are called.
